

Gallatin's Police Department: Growing to Meet Your Needs

As the City of Gallatin grows, so do the needs of our citizens. The City is expanding at all corners and the Police Department is growing to meet those needs.

Department headquarters remain downtown at 130 W. Franklin Street. PD training rooms and offices are also located in the Shalom Zone/ Union High Resource Center at 600 Small Street (pictured above).

A new police satellite station has opened in the Sumner Station complex (middle picture) at 225 Big Station Camp Blvd. The station is not staffed full-time, but allows officers working in the western section of the city to write reports and handle paperwork without having to return downtown. The satellite station helps reduce response time on calls in the area.



"This is not a precinct where citizens can walk in and expect an officer to be present," explained Police Chief Don Bandy, "But if a citizen has a non-emergency, an officer can meet them at the new Sumner Station satellite office. It helps us better serve our citizens in their neighborhood."

If you do have an emergency, you should call 911. If you have a matter that is not an emergency, but you'd like assistance from the police, please call 615-452-1313.

"Our new satellite station and annex on South Water are signs of Gallatin's growth," Chief Bandy said. "We are happy to have a presence in several sections of Gallatin. We will continue to grow with the City to serve our community and our citizens."

Get the Plate: It Supports our City in 2 Ways

Show your love for Gallatin by pre-ordering a Scenic & Historic Gallatin license plate. You'll not only demonstrate your love and pride for your hometown, but also help contribute to marketing our city to millions of families and hundreds of businesses all over the region.

Pre-orders for the new, state-approved plate are underway. This effort is being managed by our Gallatin Area Chamber of Commerce. There must be pre-orders for a minimum of 1,000 plates before the State of Tennessee will begin issuing the plates at all County Clerks' offices throughout the state.



Each plate will cost \$35 in addition to your annual tag renewal fee. The Gallatin Area Chamber of Commerce will receive \$15.62 annually for each Gallatin plate purchased or renewed. This money will be used strictly for marketing the City of Gallatin throughout our region.
