SUBJECT:

Congestion Mitigation & Air Quality Program (CMAQ) Grant

SUMMARY:

The Planning Department and the Engineering Division request approval to apply for a CMAQ grant with the Tennessee Department of Transportation for two bike/ped projects intended to help reduce air pollution in the area. The Council approved staff to submit letter of intent on April 26th. The letters of intent were sent to the TDOT in late May.

TDOT approached the City concerning interest in participating in the program. The program is designed to specifically develop projects or programs that will reduce air pollution. Based upon the grant requirements, parameters, and previous City interest and needs, staff proposes two bicycle and pedestrian improvement projects for funding. These include:

- Nashville Pike sidewalk from Greenwave Drive to Lock 4 Road -.37 miles - (\$1 million), and
- Volunteer State/GAP Trail Greenway Project from Thorne Blvd. to the eastern side of

Volunteer State Community College - 1.63 miles - (\$2,950,000)

The CMAQ grant requires a 20 percent local match. Total estimated costs of the two projects is \$3,950,000 which will require a local match of \$790,000. (Engineering will be working on cost estimate refinements prior to submittal of the application.) The TDOT has approximately \$27 million statewide for this program for the next fiscal year.
