

What are Truck Routes?

Truck routes are State and U.S. highways and local streets that the City Council has designated for trucks weighing more than 26,000 lbs to use while traveling in the City.

How do I know which streets are designated as Truck Routes?

Truck Route signs are posted on designated Truck Routes throughout the City. In addition, a map of truck routes in the City of Gallatin is available on the city's website, www.gallatinonthemove.com.

Will I be able to use routes not designated as a truck route?

The use of streets other than designated truck routes is permitted only where reasonable necessary for trucks to access businesses and make service calls and deliveries. Drivers must also be able to provide a bill of lading and/or receipt to show the reason for travel outside a designated route.



GALLATIN MUNICIPAL CODE

Sec. 16-3: Weight limit on vehicles using city streets and designation of truck routes and routes for vehicles transporting hazardous substances or materials

(a) It shall be unlawful for any vehicle having a gross vehicular weight in excess of 26,000 pounds to occupy or travel on any portion of the streets of the City of Gallatin, Tennessee, except for the following assigned Truck Routes:

(1) SR-6/US-31-E (Nashville Pike, portion of West Main Street and West Broadway Avenue, and East Broadway Avenue) from to the western to eastern city limits

(2) SR-109 (portion of S Water Avenue and SR-109 North and South) in its entirety

(3) SR-25 (Red River Road) from western city limits to SR-109

(4) SR-25 (Hartsville Pike) from eastern city limits to Airport Road

(5) SR-386 in its entirety

(6) SR-174 (Long Hollow Pike) from western city limits to SR-109

(7) SR-174 (Albert Gallatin Avenue) and Old Highway 109 North to SR-109 North

(8) Big Station Camp Boulevard between SR-6 (Nashville Pike) and SR-174 Long Hollow Pike

(9) Greenlea Boulevard from SR-6 (Nashville Pike) to SR-386

(10) All ingress and egress to downtown Gallatin, even for local delivery, shall be made via a designated truck route

(11) South Water Avenue (north of SR-109 into downtown Gallatin) shall be used for local deliveries and to access businesses along S Water Avenue and downtown Gallatin

(12) SR-25 (Red River Road) from SR-109 to SR-6 shall be used for local deliveries and to access businesses along SR-25 and downtown Gallatin

(13) SR-25 (West Main Street, East Main Street and Hartsville Pike) from SR-6 (West Main Street) to Airport Road shall be used for local deliveries and to access business along SR-25 and downtown Gallatin

(14) SR-174 (Long Hollow Pike) from SR-109 to SR-25 (Red River Road) shall be used for local deliveries and to access business along SR-174, SR-25 (Red River Road) and downtown Gallatin

(15) Peach Valley Road shall be used to access the Gallatin Wastewater Treatment Plant


(b) The use of streets other than these routes is permitted only where reasonably necessary to enable the driver of such vehicle to make a service call or delivery to or from a business or other location within the area where the vehicle is stopped. The use of streets other than these designated routes shall be presumed to be unlawful, unless the driver of the vehicle can provide to the arresting officer a bill of lading or other document or receipt showing a delivery or pick-up in the area in which the stop is made.

(c) Nothing herein shall apply to vehicles of any person rendering services to the city by contract or agreement, nor to vehicles of any public utility or public body when the same are en route to or from points within the city in connection with public business.

(d) This ordinance shall not prohibit the transport of recreational vehicles, boats, or the delivery of wide loads or manufactured housing with escorts in accordance with State Law

(e) It shall be unlawful for any vehicle transporting hazardous materials or substances, as defined in the fire code and under state law, to occupy or travel on any streets of the City of Gallatin, except for those streets designated as a truck route and except where reasonably necessary to enable the driver to make expeditious delivery of such materials or substances and only while so engaged in such delivery.

(f) Each violation of this section shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00)
